Title: Paid Maternity Leave: Effect on Firm Performance and Individual's Decision.

Abstract: The paper tries to investigate the counter-intuitive effect of paid maternity leave on overall firm performance using a multi-stage game over a period of two years with continuous action space. It is perceived by the firm that a woman returning from maternity leave will be less capable in her job due to loss of human capital. Firms, therefore, expect them to generate lesser output after leave than before leave. Contrary to that, we found that female workers, in fact, produce more output to compensate for this reduced perception about their abilities thereby increasing the overall firm output. This change in the firm's perception about the ability of the female worker depends on the duration of leave she decides to take out of the maximum paid maternity leave given by the firm as per the law. The empirical research of the paper is underway and will soon be ready to publish.
